CUT

Edit your videos. Turn your LEARN + PLAY videos into a 4-minute game!

INTRO

Open with a greeting from the community member that is teaching the language.

LEARN

Show the new words clearly, with text or effects so that players can learn easily.

PLAY

Make the game into a quiz moment, leave short pauses so players can answer.

REVEAL

Always show the correct answer to reinforce learning.

*EDITING TIPS

- Use free apps like CapCut, iMovie, Clipchamp, or DaVinci Resolve. Or use Premiere Pro, Final Cut.
- Cut out long pauses & noise, keep it flowing!
- Add text for key vocab + clear instructions.
- Use music, buzzers, and playful graphics to boost the fun.
- Keep transitions simple (fades, cuts).
- Download helpful images and film from the Lingo Bingo Toolbox online.
- Export as MP4, 1080p for easy sharing.

ACTION!

Take your video to the streets and invite the city to play!

OPTION 1

The Lingo Bingo Wagon

Build a rolling cart with: a battery (car battery or portable power station), a projector, or television screen, speakers, and 2 buzzers for players. Go mobile! Bring the game to parks, streets, or even the places where you filmed.

OPTION 2 Open Air Screening

Set up your projector in one location, a plaza, schoolyard, or community center. Project the game, invite the crowd, and let the matches begin. Add small prizes for winners.

LINGO BINGO

is a community arts project that celebrates language diversity through street performances, public interventions, games and collaborative video-making.

This DIY TUTORIAL will guide you in bringing LINGO BINGO to your neighborhood, association, school, or any community setting.



1 LEARN

Teach a language with someone from your community.

REACH OUT

Talk to neighbors, and reach out to shops, schools, and community centers.

Ask: "What language do you speak? Want to teach us a few words on camera?"

Choose someone excited to share their language, maybe invite them to play a demo game.

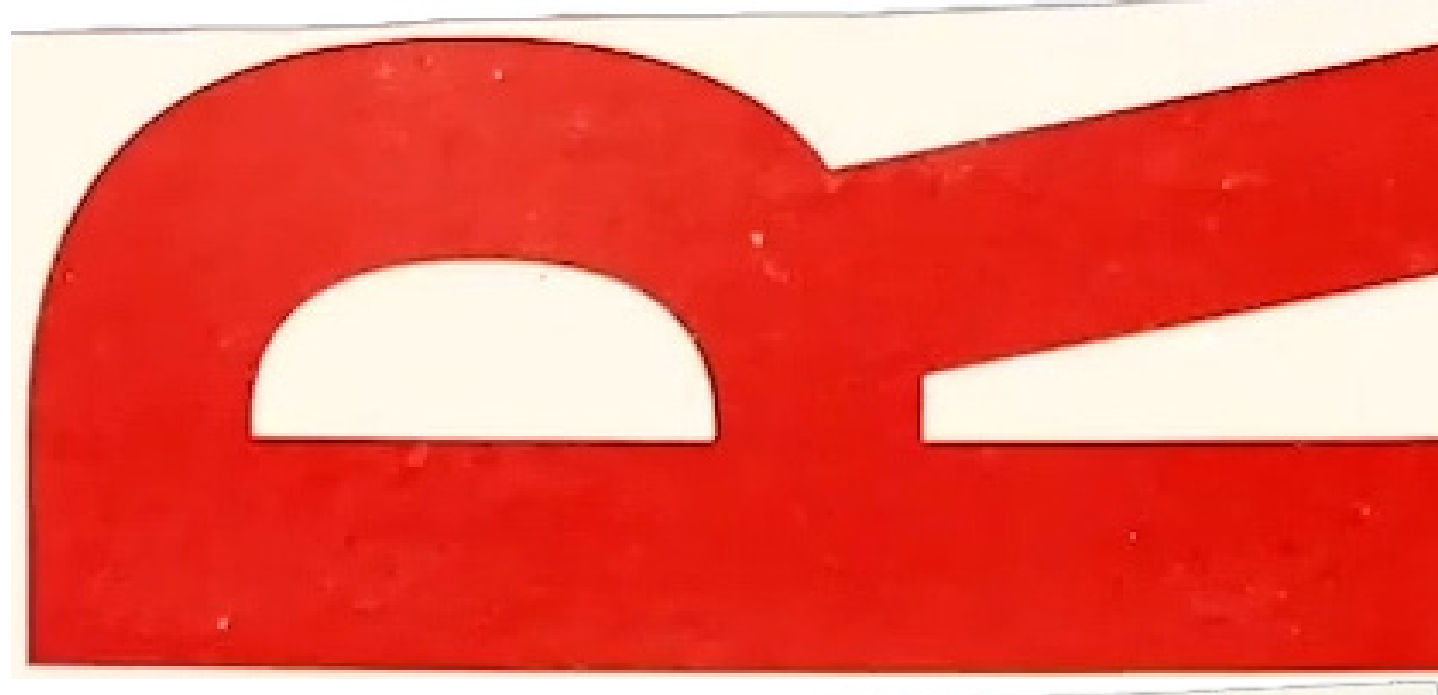
CO-CREATE THE VIDEO

Choose meaningful words participants want to share and teach, greetings, foods, directions, etc.

Rehearse together: speak clearly, repeat twice, look at the camera

Film with your phone in their everyday space like a shop, park, or corner store.

Add simple props, chalk, signs, or arrows, to keep it fun and playful!



2 PLAY

Turn your neighborhood into a language game!

DESIGN A GAME

Make it fun: Take inspiration from classic word games, like Scrabble, Hangman or word searches. Remix them, or create something new!

Enhance your games with stop-motion, poster art, or live performance in the streets.



URBAN GAME BOARD

Use benches, trees, sidewalks, windows, real places. Include local faces, shopkeepers, passersby in your game.

Keep it connected to the Learn video (same words, same vibe).

FILM!

Bring props, costumes, and energy! Use a phone or camera + mic. Be open - surprises make it special.
